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recently hired to collaborate with the principal, parents and the community to help engage the groups to work together.

In an effort to build a stronger team of teachers and administrators, all faculty are now required to serve on at least one sub-committee of the Westchester High Governance Council. He is also getting the administrators more involved by having them visit three classrooms a day in hopes the teachers will notice a much more in-touch administration.

While Canosa-Carr works on making progress at Westchester High, he reminds the community that people are welcome to visit the campus and attend events.

While Westchester has had its share of principals over the year, Visitation's Christopher Watson has replaced Carol Crede who had a thirty-plus year career as Visitation's principal before retiring in June. Watson previously held a position at Our Lady of Peace in the San Fernando Valley.

Said Watson when asked about being the new principal, "It's almost like you are taking over a legacy. It's been really nice to come into the school with new ideas."

Watson plans to take a look at the curriculum and has revamped the language arts and music programs at the school. He remains mindful of keeping families dedicated to the
