## Westchester Lutheran Project Approved

In a unanimous vote at its June 15 meeting, the West Los Angeles Area Planning Commission approved Westchester Lutheran School's proposed classroom modernization project as well as permit the relocation of the school's middle school students to the Sepulveda Boulevard site.

"American Traditions," this year's Fourth of July parade theme, brings floats, marching bands, community groups and special events to the parade route.

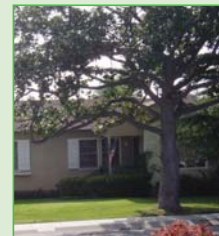
